UPDATE FROM CHAIRWOMAN DAVIS - AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARP) was passed by Congress on March 20, 2021, and signed into law on March 11, 2021. The plan contains over \$20 billion in relief for all Tribal governments. The Comptroller, Legal Counsel and myself have participated in several Tribal consultations with various federal agencies in reference to allocation methodologies, timelines of disbursement of funds, and implementation policy discussions. Tribal consultations are ongoing in April before the United States Treasury will send out final guidance on how the ARP funds will be distributed to the Tribes. We have provided written comments to the Department of Interior and to other federal agencies during their consultations.

The American Rescue Plan does specify equitable amounts to be distributed to the 574 federally recognized tribes as of February 2, 2021. The Tribe will initially receive \$1.2 million; the remaining \$19 billion allocation formula has not yet been determined. The Tribe will be eligible to receive additional ARP funds once the Treasury, Health and Human Services, Federal Transit Administration, Bureau of Indian Affairs and other agencies finalize their allocation and grant guidelines. We have also joined Federal Agency consultations with other Tribal governments during late March and April. We are expecting funding allocations from the governmental agencies in May 2021. They will issue final guidance for funding allocations at that time.

At this time, we do not have the information on how the ARP funds will be distributed, or the parameters for expending the funds, once we receive that information, we will work together with our Departments, Executive Team and Tribal Council on how to budget for programs and projects. Initially, we have held a workshop with Legal Counsel, Departments, Executive Team and Tribal Council

ADCES7 Self-care Behaviors!

The ADCES7 Self-care Behaviors is a robust framework for self-management of diabetes and other related conditions, such as prediabetes and cardio metabolic diseases.

The ADCES7 is the framework for achieving behavior change that leads to effective self-management through improved behavior and clinical outcome measures.

The ADCES7 model guides the health care team in effective person centered collaboration and goal setting to achieve health-related outcomes and improved quality of life.

A person- centered approach to diabetes, prediabetes and cardio metabolic care means = acknowledging the whole person in the context of their life and relationships.

The ADCES7 = healthy coping, healthy eating, being active, taking medication, monitoring, reducing risk, and problem solving.

By using these behaviors as a foundation for diabetes education, the patient can go beyond basic information and start sharing in successful behavior change that is outcomes-driven using person-centered, self-

determined goals.

The diabetes care and education specialist focus includes not only diabetes care, education, and ongoing support of self-management but also related conditions such as obesity, prediabetes, diabetes-related complications, and cardio metabolic disease.

This revised position statement blends research updates and ADCES's vision and expansion beyond diabetes to revise the ADCES7 framework and encompasses the varied perspective of the health care team.

Although originally presented in a list format, the ADCES7 Self-Care Behaviors overlap in nature, specifically the knowledge and skills to master them, barriers associated with their mastery, and associated outcome measures. Accordingly, ADCES has revised the image associated with the ADCES7 to underscore the interrelatedness of these behaviors ([Figure 1](#)).

Advances in the science of DSMES emphasize the independent effect of the emotional burden of diabetes on metabolic and quality-of-life outcomes. Because Healthy Coping must begin before learning can occur, this behavior is centrally located at the core of the new image ([Figure 1](#)) to symbolize its significance in sustainable diabetes self-management. The inner ring contains Healthy Eating, Being Active, and Taking Medication. These behaviors often serve as the basis for care plans because they comprise what individuals with diabetes and related conditions undertake regularly as they self-manage their condition. The next ring, monitoring, encircles these 4 self-care behaviors. By collecting personalized data, monitoring helps convert some of the intangible components of diabetes into perceptible ones. The knowledge gained and the ability to use the information from monitoring can drive behavior change. Equally important, the outer ring contains the less tangible self-care behaviors of Reducing Risk and Problem Solving, which greatly influence motivation, goal setting, and the ability to transform goals into action. The updated image of the ADCES7 depicts this interconnectivity.

- WHEREAS,** *Each year many residents of the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation experience the trauma, pain, humiliation, and personal as well as financial losses of being victims of crime; and*
- WHEREAS,** *This commemorative week celebrates the energy, perseverance, and commitment that launched the victims' rights movement, inspired its progress, and continues to advance the cause of justice to insure crime victims have a meaningful role in the justice process; and*
- WHEREAS,** *crime can leave a lasting impact on any person, regardless of age, national origin, race, creed, religion, sexual orientation, or economic status: and*
- WHEREAS,** *servicing victims, honoring their rights, and being responsive to their diverse needs, restores hope to survivors and supports healthy, thriving communities; and*
- WHEREAS,** *engaging both expertise and criminal justice partners in responses to victim need creates critical links between victims and services that improve their safety, healing, and access to justice.*

NIXON DAYCARE WILL OPEN ON MONDAY APRIL 19, 2021

Only the center will re-open, as the modular will not be ready to move in for a couple months.

Please note the limited conditions:

Parents provide sack lunches until further notice (both centers)

Daycare will provide breakfast & snack (both centers)

Daycare Staff will use all disposable plates, bowls, cups and utensils (both centers)

Update on the Nixon modular: still needs power/heat, ramp, handrail, fence installed

Nixon classrooms are allowed the following:

At both centers we have touchless faucets in all the bathrooms, touchless soap dispensers, touchless hand sanitizer dispensers where needed.

Nixon will NOT be accepting school-age children at this time ,due to the modular not being ready for them to use. Modular will not be ready for about a couple months

Wadsworth will not be opening until April 26th; construction on the modular is taking longer than anticipated.

Wadsworth hours will be from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Classroom A-4

Modular D-4

Modular F-4

At both sites, the children will have different times to be outside; they will eat in their classrooms. Nixon has a safety officer who will be sanitizing throughout the day at the center.

SANITARY MEASURES

- At both centers before a child enters the center, they will have their temp checked, given hand sanitizer and then enter the center wash their hands with soap and water. They will be given a new mask that they will keep at the center in their cubby, they will then go to their classroom, Parents will be given a number to call when they come to drop off/ pick up their child, the children will wash their hands before staff take them out to the parent.
- NO parent/guardians will be allowed in the building
- Per Indian Health Services (IHS) recommendations we will suspend children brushing their teeth until further notice.
- All staff will wear masks at all times, schedules will be set so only one staff be one site per classroom, staff will have their temp checked daily when they arrive and screened before entering the building

REAL ID

It's the law.

Passed by Congress in 2005, the REAL ID Act enacted the 9/11 Commission's recommendation that the federal government "set standards for the issuance of sources of identification, such as driver's licenses." The Act established minimum security standards for state-issued driver's licenses and identification cards and prohibits federal agencies, like TSA, from accepting for official purposes licenses and identification cards from states that do not meet these standards.

Check for the star.

Beginning **October 1, 2021**, every air traveler 18 years of age and older will need a REAL ID-compliant driver's license or another acceptable form of ID to fly within the United States. REAL ID-compliant cards are generally marked with a star located in the upper portion of the card. If you're not sure, contact your state driver's license agency on how to obtain a REAL ID-compliant card.

When do I need to get a REAL ID?

Beginning **October 1, 2021**, you will need have a REAL ID-compliant driver's license or another acceptable form of ID, such as a valid passport or U.S. military ID, to fly within the U.S.

How do I get a REAL ID?

Check with your state driver's license agency. You will need to go in person to present documentation to verify who you are and where you live in order to get your REAL ID.

IDs that fly.

Acceptable forms of ID for air travel include:

- REAL ID driver's license or other REAL ID-compliant state photo identity card issued by Department of Motor Vehicles (or equivalent)
- U.S. passport
- U.S. passport card
- DHS trusted traveler card (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST)
- U.S. Department of Defense ID, including IDs issued to dependents
- Permanent resident card
- Border crossing card
- DHS-designated enhanced driver's license
- Federally recognized, tribal-issued photo ID
- HSPD-12 PIV card
- Foreign government-issued passport
- Canadian provincial driver's license or Indian and Northern Affairs Canada card
- Transportation worker identification credential (TWIC™)
- U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Employment Authorization Card (I-766)
- U.S. Merchant Mariner Credential

PYRAMID LAKE WATERCRAFT INSPECTION AND DECONTAMINATION STATION OPENING

SPRING 2021

The Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe's Aquatic Invasive Species Program, in collaboration with Pyramid Lake Fisheries, will be opening the Watercraft Inspection and Decontamination (WID) Station in Sutcliffe, NV located at the junction of Sutcliffe Drive and NV State Route 445, Spring 2021.

The WID Station has been put in place to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species (AIS) to the waters within the Pyramid Lake Paiute Reservation. AIS can cause detrimental impacts to the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe's economy, ecosystem, recreation, and cultural resources. Once AIS are established, they are often impossible to eradicate making prevention the most cost-effective and ecologically protective approach. Aquatic invasive species of concern include, but are not limited to, quagga and zebra mussels, New Zealand mudsnails, Eurasian watermilfoil, curly leaf pondweed, Asian clams, and Signal crayfish.

To ensure aquatic invasive species are not spread, AIS Program Certified Inspectors will check outside (watercraft, trailer, motor) and inside (bilge, bladder tanks, livewell, storage compartments, gear). Please ensure your watercraft and equipment are free of all:

- Standing water
- Plants and animals
- Mud
- Wet gear not limited to waders, personal flotation devices, floaties, etc.
- Any other conditions that may harbor aquatic invasive species

If conditions are found that may harbor aquatic invasive species, the watercraft will require a decontamination prior to launching at Pyramid Lake. Please arrive **Clean, Drain, and Dry** so you can get out on the water quickly.

Large signs will be posted on NV State Route 446 outside Nixon and along Pyramid Highway near the Creel Station informing visitors whether the station is open or closed daily. When the station is closed, all boaters are asked to complete a "Self-Inspection Form" located at the Rangers Station, Pelican Boat Launch, and arriving soon at Popcorn Rock.

The AIS Program will establish a schedule for operating the WID Station and post on websites and Facebook, and at the Rangers Station in Sutcliffe, NV. The AIS Program will keep the community updated about when the WID Station will officially open and of any changes to where the schedule for operations will be located.

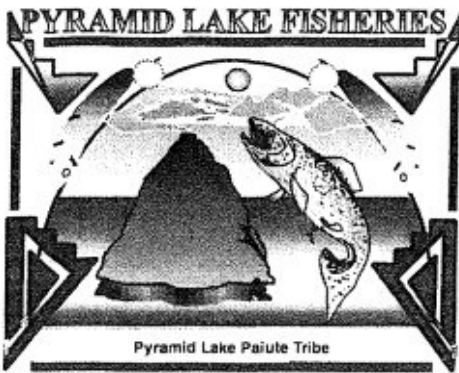

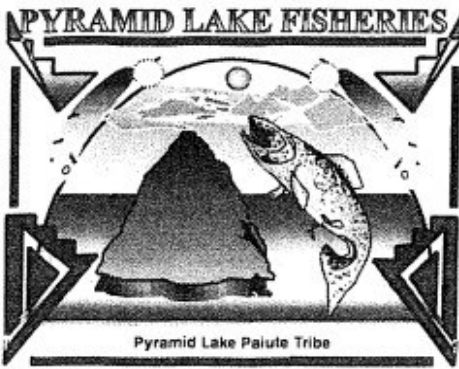

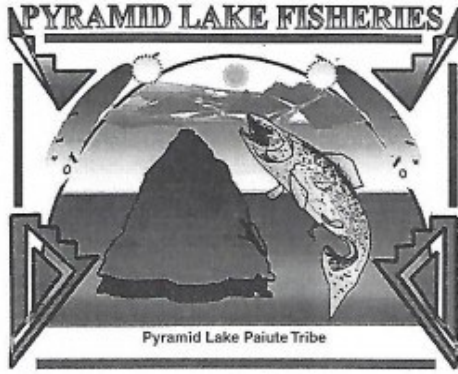
